Fact Cards:

Direct Quote – "A phobia is an unrealistic fear that is all out of proportion to the actual threat. The fear of spiders, for instance, would be present even when there were no spiders around."

Paraphrase- A phobia is an unreasonable response to a situation.

Direct Quote- "As the name suggests, a specific phobia is an unreasonable fear of a specific thing, animal, or situation."

Paraphrase- The results of a 2001 poll put snakes at the top of the list of most feared phobias.
